FAMILY SHABBAT TABLE COMPANION:

Your best friend at the Shabbat table!
Ask these questions at the Shabbat table and see what your family has to say!

1. This week's Torah portion features Moshe beginning to review the entire Torah for all of the Jewish people before they go into Eretz Yisrael. Our Sages explained, and Rashi quoted them, that Moshe explained the Torah in 70 different languages. One of the tragedies we fast and mourn for was the translation of the Torah into Greek. When is it OK to translate the Torah and when is it a tragedy to translate the Torah?
2. We know it's forbidden to say something derogatory about someone else. Is it lashon hara to talk to a friend about a situation you're having with someone else who they know without using names but realizing that there's a small chance they may figure out who you're talking about?
3. The Torah gives us a mitzvah to verbally sanctify the day of Shabbat by reciting kiddush at the start of Shabbat. Kiddush is differentiating the Shabbat day from a weekday through praising God. Why is it important to praise God at the start of Shabbat?

THE PARSHA

Shabbat Shalom!

This Shabbat we begin an entirely new sefer in the Torah. Sefer Devarim is the fifth and last sefer in the Torah. In sefer Devarim, Moshe tells Bnei Yisrael a story. The story Moshe tells Bnei Yisrael is a story they know well, it is their story from the time they left Egypt until Moshe's last days with them as they get ready to enter Eretz Yisrael. Moshe tells the Jewish people that when they get into Eretz Yisrael there will be people who are going to try and stop them from living in Eretz Yisrael. Hashem says that even if the people are stronger and bigger Hashem will protect them.
